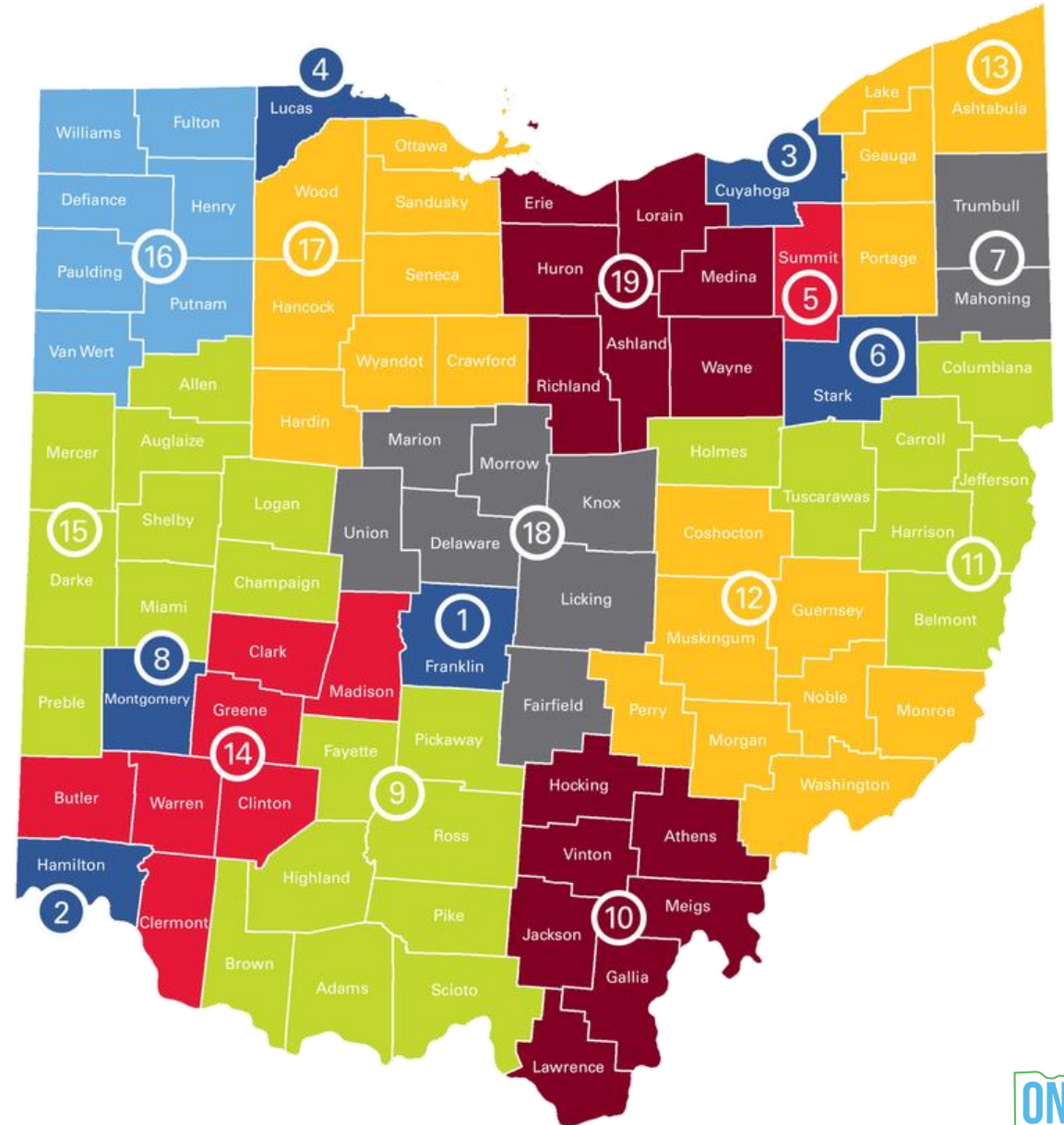

REGISTRATION & COMPLIANCE

ELIGIBILITY:

To be eligible for OneOhio funding, organizations must be in good standing and meet the following criteria:

- Tax-exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) or other relevant sections of the Internal Revenue Service Code; or
- Private, for-profit organizations offering services that meet the charitable purpose of the Foundation; or
- Any form of state or local government.

APPROVED PURPOSES

Approved Purpose(s) shall mean

Evidence-based forward-looking strategies, programming and services used to

- (i) expand the availability of treatment for individuals affected by substance use disorders,*
- (ii) develop, promote and provide evidence-based substance use prevention strategies,*
- (iii) provide substance use avoidance and awareness education,*
- (iv) decrease the oversupply of licit and illicit opioids, and*
- (v) support recovery from addiction services performed by qualified and appropriately licensed providers, as is further set forth in the agreed Ohio Abatement Strategies.*

QUICK GUIDE TO MEETING THE EVIDENCE-BASED REQUIREMENT



Quick Guide to Meeting the Evidence-Based Requirement: How to Identify & Integrate Evidence into Your Grant Application

What does it mean to be evidence-based?

Being evidence-based means using the most reliable and relevant research findings to inform decision-making, actions, and beliefs.

Why do I need to demonstrate an evidence-base for my application?

The OneOhio MOU stipulates that funded projects and programs using Ohio's opioid settlement dollars be evidence-based.

Different Types of Evidence

- **Evidence-based** – a program, practice, policy, strategy, or intervention that has been identified by multiple peer-reviewed articles and/or by a nationally recognized organization, a federal agency, or agency of this state and has produced a consistent, positive pattern of results on the majority of the intended recipients or target population.
- **Evidence-informed** – a program, practice, strategy, policy, or intervention developed based on the best peer-reviewed research available in the field. These activities have a strong scientific basis for their use and there is confidence from recognized institutions that these will have a consistent positive pattern of results or fit within best-practice frameworks.
- **Practice-based evidence** - evidence that is collected in real world scenarios, rather than the more tightly controlled environments that are common in many research studies. One example of where to find these practice-based evidence “practices” would be to look at national or state reports, evaluation reports for current programs, etc.
- **Promising practice** - has demonstrated potential effectiveness based on preliminary evidence or qualitative observations. These practices show promise but may require further evaluation to establish their efficacy definitively.
- **Innovation** - refers to the development or implementation of new approaches, techniques, technologies, programs, or interventions that challenge or shift current research or practice paradigms.

Where can I find examples of evidence-based strategies?

The OneOhio Recovery Foundation has begun the creation of an Evidence-Based Compendium to encourage organizations to infuse evidence into their work and grant applications and to provide a resource when completing the application questions related to evidence-base.

UNALLOWABLE EXPENSES

Unallowable:

Applications may be declined if it includes any of the following exclusions below:

- Funds cannot be used for non-abatement strategies;
- Funds cannot be used for recipient staff benefit items – i.e. gift cards, rebates, travel points (Note: incentives for program recipients is allowable);
- Costs incurred prior to the grant award date;
- Costs for alcoholic beverages and marijuana;
- Costs for fundraising events;
- Costs for lobbying or political campaign contributions;
- Legal costs or opioid litigation expenses;
- Costs for non-FDA approved medications for the treatment of substance use disorders;
- Costs for sub-grants/sub-awards will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis; and
- Costs for activities that may be prohibited by state or federal law.

DIRECT, INDIRECT COSTS AND SUPPLANTING

- Costs must be for new or expanded programs and services. Applicants cannot use Foundation funds to replace, divert, or supplant current funds for past or current expenditures.
- Costs directly attributed to the delivery of the proposed abatement strategy are referred to as a Direct Cost and are allowable.
- Grantees may use up to 10% of their grant to cover new or expanded administrative costs associated with implementing their proposal.

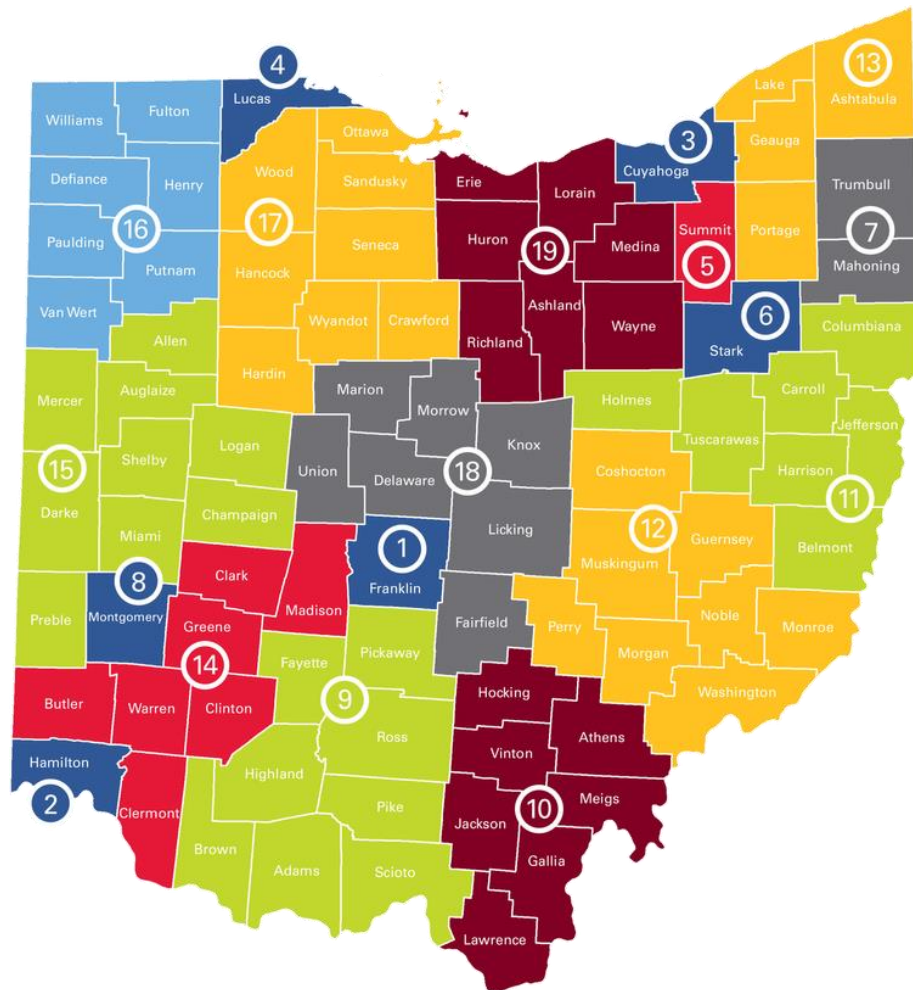

All registered entities must use the OneOhio grant portal to apply for funding.

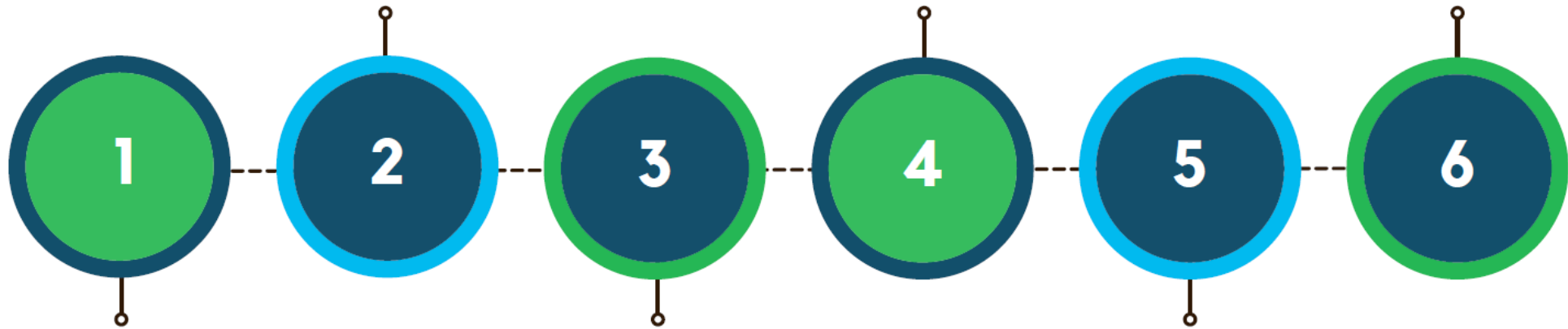
Apply in Grant Portal

Expert Panel Review

The Board of Directors must vote to affirm a grant award before funds may be disbursed.

Final Board Approval



Registration & Compliance

All entities must register in the grant portal before applying. All entities must pass a compliance check in order to be eligible to receive funding.

Region Review

The 19 Regional Grant Review Committees will receive, review, and recommend funding for projects in their respective regions.

Grant Committee Review

The OneOhio Grant Oversight Committee will review region recommendations and Expert Panel input before making a final recommendation to the Board of Directors.

GRANT AGREEMENT & REPORTING

- All recipients will be required to submit at least one program report and at least one financial report.
- All reporting requirements and deadlines will be clearly stated in the grant agreement between the recipient and the Foundation. Acceptance of funds indicates agreement to the terms of reporting.
- The Foundation reserves the right to request supplementary information, in-person site visits, and/or virtual meetings, if necessary, in addition to the grant agreement reporting to effectively report outcomes to the public. The Foundation also reserves the right to end relationships with grant recipients who do not meet reporting requirements.

The process has been developed through guidance provided in the opioid lawsuit settlements, the OneOhio Memorandum of Understanding, and the OneOhio Grant Policy. About OneOhio
The OneOhio Recovery Foundation is a private, non-profit organization created at the direction of Ohio's state and local leaders to distribute 55 percent of the funds our state will receive from the pharmaceutical industry as a consequence of its role in the national opioid epidemic. The Foundation will work with local experts and leaders from throughout Ohio, providing representation from 19 OneOhio Regions. For the Regional Grant Cycle, each of the 19 OneOhio Regions will establish committees to review and recommend funding awards that align with the Ohio Abatement Strategies and based on local priorities. If applicable, the Foundation has original funding priority areas. All funding priority areas will be in accordance with these guidelines and the OneOhio Memorandum of Understanding, outlining the Foundation's funding priorities, including:

RFP Key Points
AVAILABLE FUNDING: Awards in the 2024 Regional Grant Cycle will total no more than ~\$51.19 million. Current funding available within each of the 19 OneOhio Regions is detailed in the RFP.

ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS: The 2024 Regional Grants are available to a wide array of organizations and/or that serve Ohioans. Applicants may be non-profit entities, for-profit entities, or government entities. All grantees must provide services that align with the Ohio Abatement Strategies and must clear a compliance check in order to be eligible for funding.

APPROVED USES OF FUNDS: The OneOhio MOU includes a full list of Approved Purpose Categories. Development of the allowable uses of funding for the 2024 Regional Grant Cycle. All projects must be evidence-based, forward-looking strategies for the purposes of prevention, treatment, and abatement of substance use and co-occurring disorders.
